INFRASTRUCTURE WORK BY TELKOM and PETITION FROM HIGH RIDGE ESTATE

Telkom

We wish to inform the residents that Telkom has commenced working at the Estate, having started at the Terraces and The Hills already. They are performing maintenance work on their old infrastructure and installing fibre lines at the same time so that ultimately, they will switch over from copper to fibre.

Should Telkom need to have access to your home, they will contact the resident directly by means of an "Access Notice Letter".

For those residents who attended the AGM, you will recall that this matter was briefly discussed and residents were informed of the work done by Telkom. It was also proposed that a separate meeting be held for those members who required more detail from the sub-committee members on the installation of fibre. Petition from High Ridge

Subsequent to the meeting, the Board received a request from High Ridge, to sign a petition that they have prepared addressed to the Speaker at the City Council of Tshwane. (Refer attached petition). The Board is willing to support High Ridge in this initiative. Peter Anderson and Marnus Sonnenberg will be going to each resident to obtain your signature for the petition. Please use this time to share any ideas you may also have as to how to remove the squatters from the SAWS grounds with Peter and Marnus.

WBHOA will continue with its own initiative on this matter, regardless of the petition from High Ridge above, which could include independent legal action against the SAWS.
